Applying with Mulch

For best weed control, we recommend applying Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer after spreading mulch on your flower and shrub beds. Sprinkle it on top of mulch at a surface rate (see picture above), being sure to keep granules away from plant foliage. Immediately water this product into mulch. If watering-in is not convenient, lightly rake into top layer of mulch. Always wash or brush off any Preen granules from plants following application.

Ear / Ise On Vegetables

First remove all existing weeds, then lightly rake to prepare a smooth soil surface. Uniformly mix Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer into the top 1-2 inches of soil immediately after application, using care not to damage any established crops. Rate of application depends on type of soil. Apply at 1 lb. per 320 sq. ft. for heavy clay-type soils, at 1 lb. per 480 sq. ft. for medium loam soils, and at 1 lb. per 640 sq. ft. for light sandy soils.

Before Seeding: Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Carrots, Cauliflower, Collard Greens, Endive, Lettuce, Mustard Greens, Radishes, Spinach, Swiss Chard, Turnips.

BEANS, Mustard Greens, Okra, Radish, Southern Peas (**Cow Peas**), Snap Beans, Turnip Greens.

AFTER Seeding or Transplanting: Cantaloupes, Cucumbers, Watermelons. Apply after plants have developed 5 or more leaves.

AFTER Planting: Potatoes (except Maine) - May be applied after planting, before or after emergence. Use care not to damage seed pieces in cultivating nor allow treated soil to contact emerged plant foliage.

BEFORE Transplanting: Celery, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Eggplant, Peppers, Onions, Tomatoes.

Permanent Vegetables: Asparagus - Apply prior to spear emergence of established plants.

What This Green Product Does

green Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer is a two-way product that feeds with a high quality plant food and at the same time prevents most weeds from germinating in flower and vegetable gardens, in ground covers, and around trees and shrubs. Although this product will not kill existing weeds, it prevent new weeds from sprouting - eliminating the need for difficult and time-consuming hand weeding. Without weeds, your valuable plants can grow larger and stronger. Your beds will stay neat and weed-free all season long.

When to Apply

Apply Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer anytime during the growing season around established plants and transplants. This product should not be used on flower seeds. It can be used after flowering plants have germinated and are 2-3 inches tall. This product may also be incorporated into the soil when seeding vegetables or applied after mulching beds. Since it does not kill existing weeds, you must first remove any that have begun to grow. Applying this product as early as possible, you can eliminate the need for hand weeding.

How to Apply

To avoid plant injury, do not apply Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer when plants are dry. Sprinkle this product on soil surface after it has rained or been irrigated. When plants are dry, Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer may damage the leaves of sensitive plants. If you have any questions about your specific planting situation, once Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer has been applied, contact your local extension agent or nurseryman. Once Preen Garden Weed Preventer Plus Fertilizer has been applied, it forms a weed control barrier in the top layer of soil, preventing seeds from germinating. Disturbance to the soil surface after activation may result in erratic weed control.
